Training Opportunities

The events offered weekly or monthly at MCSA are intended to provide skill building and increased challenge for shooters as they first begin learning and then wish to become more proficient.

A natural progression for the novice shooter could be to start with **Basic Pistol**. At the beginner level, for women, the **Ladies of Caliber** meet on the third Sunday of the month, where we have a revolving schedule of new things to learn and try, like Practical Pistol Competition, Action Pistol League and Steel Shoot.

To practice and improve your accuracy, **Bullseye** is every Friday night at 6PM. For an interest in self defense, you could attend **Personal Protection in the Home** 2 day classes offered at various times during the year over a weekend.

For more of an ongoing practice, the **NRA Winchester Marksmanship Programs** are once a month on Thursdays. (each of the 3 versions we offer on a different Thursday) **Winchester .22 Pistol** is the second Thursday of the month, for accuracy practice and skill building.

<u>Winchester Self Defense</u> is the third Thursday, to learn and practice self defense skills with your 38 caliber or larger firearm.

On the 4th Thursday, you can build skill and improve accuracy on your <u>.22 rifle.</u> Another option to practice more self-defense type skills is to join <u>PPC (Personal Pistol Competition)</u> and <u>APL (Action Pistol League)</u>.

These leagues are offered weekly every Tuesday night, with PPC running roughly from October until May and APL filling in the summer gap. For 38 caliber or larger. **USPSA** matches hosted at MCSA. These matches are taking the competition to a regional and then national level, so they are something to aspire to for sure! **Steel Shoot**, 1st Thursday, is a fun and challenging experience for a 38 caliber or larger firearm.

All of these events and classes provide opportunities for practice and skill building with an emphasis on safe practices, regardless of what the event or class is.
