Just some interesting stuff...

ome of you know that we recycle brass. If we punch the primers out we can get more value for the brass and we can even get value for the primers as long as we keep them separate.

Now, I admit that punching primers is a rather tedious, mind numbing operation. But I am someone that has reloaded for years and I have the equipment and some would say that I need a tedious, mind numbing task to keep me out of trouble. Maybe that is true.

I have found a few interesting things as I punch primers ...other than it really hurts if you get your finger in the way. I have come across several, what I would call plastic brass 38 special cases, some 5.7 x 28 mm cases and some brass plated steel cases.



The 5.7 x 28 is a bottleneck, rimless cartridge packed with bullets ranging in size from 23 grains to 40 grains. The muzzle velocity is typically somewhere between 2350 and 2,400 fps and 2800 fps with lighter rounds. Hopefully, whoever is dropping these into the brass recycle bin is not shooting these rounds in the range, since they would be above our limit of 1500 fps.

The other one that, as a re-loader and recycler, I would be careful with, is the brass

plated steel cases. They are 9mm and the only way to tell them apart is using a magnet, which we do to keep the steel cases separated from the brass. The larger concern is that if someone gets ahold of these and attempts to reload them they might damage the dies used for reloading. Please be careful.



The plastic 38 special cases, I have never seen before. I believe that they are used for training.


