Introduction to MCSA's Tuesday night Action Pistol League presented by Matt Crane

Matt will also explain how and why that type of shooting is great for learning how to handle your gun as a motor memory skill and do it without thought. Also, how the timer and scoring can create a sense of urgency and a little bit of panic (in a good controlled way) helping to providing some adrenaline, just like in a real-life situation.

This being an introduction, will be at whatever pace and speed the individual is comfortable with.

An outside the waistband holster and an extra magazine holder is encouraged, but not necessary.

Matt will set it up to work without both of those items and we can work with whatever an individual shows up with. The stage will probably have a 16 shot round count. We can go through it multiple times each, if time allows.



Now that Inslee has passed the bill that future magazines can only hold 10 rounds, I've been more than a little frustrated that I've been unable to find any P17s and didn't think any further down the road. One fellow I spoke with re. the situation said, go ahead and buy the bigger magazines and get the gun later! That was a "duh" moment for me! Of course gun mfrs are not going to reconfigure the guns...just the magazines. So made me wonder if other people are buying magazines for guns they intend to buy later but haven't yet.

If you want to continue to serve and make positive impacts in the lives of our nation's high school students, then consider applying to be an AFJROTC instructor. We are




